Ateneo de Manila University joins the whole Society of Jesus and the universal Church of God in mourning the death of His Holiness Pope Francis who entered into Life with our risen Lord on Easter Monday, 21 April 2025 at the age of 88.

With deep sorrow, we grieve the departure of our Holy Father whom we will forever remember as a tireless and loving shepherd who guided and inspired God's flock to the very end. From his teachings

on mercy and compassion, to his emphasis on caring for the marginalized and building a synodal Church, to his focus on justice, ecology, and poverty, as well as through his witness of a simple lifestyle, Pope Francis left an indelible mark on the Catholic Church and the world at large during the 12 years of his pontificate.
